



ENVIRONMENT
 There are great opportunities on the site for showcasing diverse existing ecosystems such as wetlands, streams, and forest. There is also the potential to create and enhance existing systems including a edge plantings, pine reforestation, and additional native planting.



TRAIL EXPERIENCE
 The trail experience has the potential to have various characteristics throughout. This can include a trailhead at the museum, a stone trail, and boardwalks that cross sensitive ecosystems. The trail can pass through a variety of experiences including interpretive areas at trail nodes and unique view sheds, while connecting major activity areas of the site.



INTERPRETATION
 Areas for ecosystem interpretation include a native plant walk and nature trail that goes through the forest, across streams, and through wetlands. Areas that offer cultural interpretation include a museum and tribal cultural center, powwow grounds, interpretive gardens and trails, and a replica of a 1580s Iroquoian Village. Interpretive areas offer a great way for the public to interact with the landscape and learn through their senses.
