- Treasure's Report: Membership / payment of administrative dues - Tribal members are reminded of obligation to pay Tribal Dues and Land Maintenance Fees as this is the money the Tribe uses for operating expenses.
- Tribal and Heritage Foundation Bank account balance on hand as of 9/10//22: <u>\$45,384.83</u>
- Tribal Bank Operating Checking Account balance on hand as of 9/10/2022: <u>\$4,321.78.</u>

- Turn In Dues/ Land Tax/Donations to FD Treasure: Chief reminds Tribal members to check their emails or the deposit spreadsheets that are being sent out at the request of Chief Brown
- Chief Brown still working on Calendars to see if we can get a discount, price has doubled

#### New Business:

- Tribal Land Status:
  - Rickie and Chief will cut the 10-acre Powwow Ground and other areas (26 acres total). Kudos to Rickie Boone for the outstanding grass cutting efforts
    Chief will put an email out about grass cutting days and workdays
- Fall School Book Scholarships, six students, (\$300 Mailed to Each by FD Treasurer).
  - All checks have been mailed to the recipients by the foundation treasurer
  - Beverly El says she has only received 2 thank you letters to the tribe for the Scholarships
- Need large donations tax exempt letters sent out on the FD Letterhead to Preservation VA, Richmond, VA for the \$1,532.13 donation.
  - Teresa Preston to send out thank you letters on Foundation letterhead for donations
- New Tribal Member Status: Last New Member was Ethan Phelps
- Thanks to tribal genealogist Snow Lizard & Silver Moon Doing super job on all the genealogy research they are doing for the tribe
  - Jordan Turner has also been doing lots of genealogy for R Turner family chief ask she sends it to the genealogist

    - School Day Invitation Letter and Agenda emailed to all Tidewater Schools, public, parochial, and home schools. (Thanks to Karen Barrett and Shelia Hinton)
    - Chief asked Sheila to give an impromptu professional background as he is thinking of utilizing her on the Tribal Council or in other positions supporting the tribe – School Coordination Committee.

- Need tribal women to carry in the bread and a tribal man to carry in the arrow.
- Need two blue blankets on one white blanket
  - The man and the woman will be wrapped individually in a blue blanket when entering the circle
  - At a point doing the ceremony they both will be wrapped together in a white blanket
  - Need a tribal woman to carry in the white blanket

- Cut 26 acres of Grass

- Need School Day Tour Guides in full Regalia for the School Day, November 4, 2022 More information to follow....
- Chief Brown is going between 2 Walmart (Franklin & Suffolk) stores to get the chairs and tables previously approved by the council
  - Chief needs assistance to store folding metal chairs in the shed, need hanging elbows to hang chairs and tables
- Chief Brown has check, \$1500 CNE rental, to deposit into the Foundation account
- CNE Tribal leadership meeting yesterday discussing new construction projects, approximately10mil

- ➡ CNE new Joint Venture created: CNE-EnProVera JV, LLC to complement CNE IT Business Unit
- Lots of hard work going on under CNE to bring in projects, the goal is to be able to break ground in 2023 to build the Tribal Cultural Center and museum, parking lot – Phase 1 and non-denominational church and Wellness Center, Phase II on the tribal land
- Tribal members IN GOOD STANDING will eventually receive a portion of the proceeds of CNE's income generated after the Cultural Center and Museum, Non-Denominational Worship Center and Wellness Center are built on the tribal land –\$1.4 mil project.
- Chief gave Gary Burnette kudos for all his good work on CNE Board and advised he would need more input on the IT side of the CNE IT Business Unit

Chief Brown closed meeting out in prayer of thanks and healing for Tribal members and family who are sick or have lost loved ones recently.
